Lithium-ion Batteries in Fire Investigations



Lithium-ion batteries can be found in all types of devices, tools, electric vehicles, and energy storage. When these batteries fail in thermal runaway, they can produce fire and explosion hazards.

This program will help fire investigators understand how battery systems fail and how those failures can lead to the battery becoming both an ignition source and gaseous fuel source.

Topics include battery system architecture, how lithium-ion batteries fail, recognizing the parts and pieces of damaged battery cells, looking at lithium-ion batteries in fire investigation, and how to help prevent battery failure occurrence.

Erik Archibald PhD, P.E. is a licensed professional engineer with expertise in explosions, lithium-ion batteries and fire dynamics. He received his PhD from the University of Texas. His research and consulting work includes expert witness investigations into fires and explosions; and models and experiments of lithium-ion explosion, fire, and toxicity hazards. Erik has conducted lithium-ion battery fire and explosion experiments ranging from single cell to room scale involving energy storage systems, consumer electronics, e-mobility devices, and electric vehicles. Erik is a structural specialist on Texas Task Force 1 Urban Search & Rescue team.
