

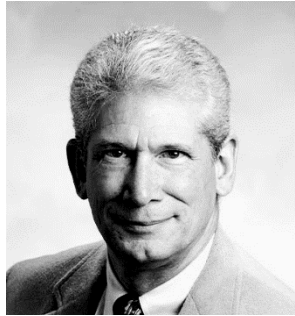

The Underwriters Laboratories Professor of Practice Dr. David Icové is an internationally recognized forensic fire engineering expert with over 40 years of experience. He is the co-author of the leading textbooks on fire investigation, including *Kirk's Fire Investigation, Forensic Fire Scene Reconstruction, and Combating Arson-for-Profit*.

Dr. Icové served over four decades as a criminal investigator on the federal, state, and local levels. He is presently a Professor in the Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering at The University of Tennessee; as well as an Adjunct Faculty member at the Department of Fire Protection Engineering, University of Maryland.

Dr. Icové is an expert in the field of fire investigation. He has testified as an expert witness in criminal and civil trials, including three times before U.S. Congressional committees regarding FBI initiatives to detect and prosecute serial arsonists.

While employed at the FBI as a Criminal Profiler, he led the development of the present-day motive classification system for arson, which is based upon case studies and lengthy prison interviews of convicted arsonists.
